As Australians prepare to elect the 45th Commonwealth Parliament, the Australian Healthcare and Hospitals Association (AHHA) calls on all candidates to commit to working together for a healthy Australia supported by the best possible health system.

The Australian healthcare system is built on a solid foundation, with Medicare and strong public healthcare and hospital sectors providing the basis for universal access to quality healthcare services.

A priority for the incoming 45th Commonwealth Parliament must be to ensure that our health system provides affordable, accessible quality care to all Australians with sustainable funding.

The Commonwealth Government has a vital role to play in the stewardship of the health system and must demonstrate a commitment to better integrated and coordinated patient-centred care across the primary, acute, aged and disability care sectors.

The AHHA calls on all candidates to commit to an innovative patient-centred health system founded in well-resourced prevention and primary care, and integrated effectively with the hospital and aged care sectors.

The AHHA calls on all parties to work constructively to achieve an effective contemporary healthcare system supporting a healthy Australia. Healthcare is a top priority for Australians and must also be a top priority for their elected representatives.

The AHHA will assess the health policies of the Coalition, Labor and the Greens against a set of guiding principles and publish a scorecard ranking their commitment to effective healthcare reform. Criteria will include whether proposed policies will improve health outcomes and support equity, accessibility and sustainability in the broader Australian health system.

AHHA is Australia’s national peak body for public hospitals and health care providers.
