Workshop 1	The organisation of the Australian healthcare system
Overview	The Australian healthcare system is a complex arrangement of public and private providers, with a diverse range of stewardship, management, care delivery and funding arrangements. This impacts on patient outcomes and experience, the providers experience and wellbeing, the health of populations and communities and the sustainability of the system (referred to as the Quadruple Aim).
	This session will provide an overview of the organisation of the healthcare system in Australia, including the:
Objectives	 The public system Primary care – Primary Health Networks, general practice, pharmacies, allied health, community health services Hospital/acute care – Local Health Districts/Networks The private system – Private Health Insurance Responsibilities of Commonwealth, state/territory and local governments Funding flows Discussion will explore a person-centred journey through the health care system;
	and how different aspects of the healthcare system impact on that journey.

	Workshop 2	An introduction to Value-Based Health Care
		Value-based health care (VBHC) is a global movement that provides a framework for restructuring healthcare systems with the overarching goal of providing value for patients.
	Overview	VBHC aims to improve the outcomes that matter to people and communities, across a full pathway of care, through the equitable, sustainable, transparent and appropriate use of resources. It provides a person-centred way to support decision making in health care, delivering a framework structure that is able to support transformation towards more sustainable healthcare models.
		Its importance in the Australian context is demonstrated through it featuring increasingly in government agreements and strategies. Shifts towards a value-based approach to health care requires collaborative efforts across the system.

	Objectives	 provide an introduction to VBHC explore key features for a value-based approach to health care, including understanding the care pathway and shared needs designing for outcomes

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Workshop 3	Designing and implementing models of VBHC
Overview	VBHC is transforming the way health care is understood and delivered in Australia towards the delivery of care built around the shared outcomes that matter to people and communities. Yet there is no single pathway for implementation.
	Each system steward, coordinating agency, service provider, team, individual clinician and consumer will have a role to play to support the transition to VBHC, with unique strengths and scope that need to be recognised and built upon to support the implementation of VBHC.
	This session will explore the design and implementation of VBHC, including:
Objectives	 the importance of an outcome driven workplace culture understanding your sphere of influence, including clinician leadership, executive buy-in and the political landscape shifts in financial risks and incentives the government agencies, entities, agreements and workplans that provide stewardship for how health care is delivered across Australia; and how they are being engaged to support the shift towards VBHC system reform Discussion will draw on the experience and background of participants to consider examples of VBHC implementation in Australian healthcare settings and feature case study examples of how concepts discussed have been applied in practice.
